Introduction to the National Science Foundation's Directorate for Social, Behavioral, and Economic Sciences

Northeastern University is hosting a webinar on the programs and funding opportunities sponsored by the National Science Foundation's (NSF) Directorate for Social, Behavioral, and Economic Sciences (SBE). The 90-minute virtual session will introduce divisions and programs within SBE and focus on ways that academics from diverse disciplinary backgrounds can successfully position their work to compete for SBE funding. Attendees will learn about SBE priorities and new initiatives from Dr. Mary Feeney, Ph.D., Program Director of the NSF Science of Science: Discovery, Communication, and Impact program. The webinar will also feature a panel of Northeastern faculty experts, who will share their insights and experiences applying for SBE research grants. Registration is required for this event, which will occur on January 30, 2024 at 8:00 a.m.
