NEH Awards \$33.8 Million in New Grants

Funding will support 260 new humanities projects nationwide, including programs at small museums, conservation research and training, education initiatives, scholarly research




Match Your Project to a Grant Program 1

I want to host a program for faculty, scholars, or practitioners to expand their knowledge of a topic or method. I want to build the capacity of an institution of higher education to support humanities activities, including developing or refining courses or curricula. I am organizing a scholarly conference. I am a scholar affiliated with an institution seeking support for my research. I am an independent scholar seeking support for my research. I am seeking support for an archaeological project. I want to preserve, digitize, and/or make a collection accessible. I want to investigate or advance methods for the preservation and access of physical or digital collections.

Division of Education Programs Humanities Initiatives



"Embedding Place-Based Humanities in Curriculum"

(St. John Fisher College, **Humanities Initiatives**, 2020)

Colleges and Universities strengthen the teaching and study of the humanities at institutions of higher education by developing new humanities programs, resources (including those in digital format), or courses, or by enhancing existing ones.

Award period: From 12 to 36 months

Maximum Award: \$150,000

Award periods must be continuous and fulltime.

Deadline: May 2024

Division of Education Programs Humanities Connections



"Developing a Humanities-Focused Food Studies Minor"

Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University (Planning Grant)

Seeks to expand the role of the humanities in undergraduate education at two- and four-year institutions. Awards support innovative curricular approaches that foster partnerships among humanities faculty and their counterparts in the social and natural sciences and in pre-service or professional programs.

Planning: \$35,000 for 12 months

Implementation: Up to \$150,000 for 18-36 months

Deadline: September 2024

Spotlight on the Humanities in Higher Education



Supports the exploration and development of small projects that would benefit underserved populations through the teaching and study of the humanities at small to medium sized institutions of higher education.

Eligibility


- two- and four-year institutions of higher education
- nonprofit organizations whose work advances the humanities at these institutions and among their faculty and students

Funding levels

- Exploration up to \$25,000 / up to 1 year
- Development up to \$60,000 / up to 2 years

Deadline: October 2024

Dialogues on the Experience of War



Supports the study and discussion of humanities sources that address the experiences of military service and war from a wide variety of perspectives.

Award Period: 12-24 months

Maximum Award: \$100,000

Applications open: June 2024

Applications close: September 2024



Institutes for K-12 and Higher Education







- Contact a program officer






Make your case

- Start with the review criteria
- Demonstrate your project's intellectual significance
- Provide context
- Make it sound interesting
- Develop a clear and realistic work plan


