### Event Series: Best Practices for Developing NEH Fellowship/Summer Stipend Proposals

The Office of the Vice President for Research and Innovation and the Oregon Humanities Center invite UO faculty to participate in a winter series of events to strengthen the development of proposals to the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) and other humanities funding agencies. [Dr. Elisa Camiscioli](#), Professor of History at Binghamton University, is an NEH award winner and leader of several NEH writing circles at her home institution. She will present a webinar titled "Best Practices for Developing Competitive NEH Fellowship/Summer Stipend Proposals" on **January 24, 2025**, from noon to 1 p.m. [Registration](#) is required.

Event attendees are encouraged *to incorporate lessons learned from the webinar* to draft or revise a three-page proposal for a 30-minute, in-person consultation during Dr. Camiscioli's visit to the UO on **February 7, 2025**. Proposal drafts should follow NEH narrative guidelines for the target program. Dr. Camiscioli will provide substantive feedback on up to 10 proposals, which will be reviewed on a first-come, first-serve basis. The timeframe for [draft submission](#) is **January 24-31, 2025**.

During her campus visit, Dr. Camiscioli will also provide an informal presentation during a hosted lunch on the model developed at her university for running an NEH grant writing circle, followed by a discussion.
