Research Advocacy for FY 26 and the New Administration: Insights from a Policy-Maker

Career Research Faculty Professional Development Opportunity

The Office of the Vice President for Research and Innovation has launched the [Career Faculty Professional Development Program](#), which helps career research faculty access professional development opportunities aligned with an individual's research position and promotion trajectory. Eligible faculty include career research faculty of all ranks at > 0.75 FTE at the UO for one year or more including research assistants, research associates, and research professors. Applicants may request funds up to \$4,000 to support activities such as attending conferences, workshops, seminars, and trainings, acquiring software, books, and training manuals, bringing guest speakers to the UO, etc. Faculty may also request salary replacement to allow them time to commit time to other activities contributing to their program of research. The deadline to [submit applications](#) this program is **January 25, 2025**.
