

**1. Pre-Award SPA Recruitment Update**

We have made a contingent offer to a candidate for the Pre-Award SPA position. Hopefully, this person will be onboard immediately after the first of the year.

2. **Budget Templates in EPCS are as of December 7 2021** – This includes OPE updates and we adjusted the Year 1 start of each template to July 1, 2022 (assuming it takes six months to acquire an award) The templates will be updated again after we have the new United Academics CBA. Until then we want to make sure that faculty starting salaries do include the 5% raise that begins January 1, 2022.

3. **EPCS DUE Date Report for DGA’s** – Just a reminder that the Due Date report is now available for DGA’s. This is a great little tool that shows:

**2. Updates to Required Registrations**

As part of the federal-wide transition from the DUN and Bradstreet (D&B) Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS) number to the new government-owned Unique Entity Identifier (UEI), applicants will be required to have a UEI to apply for federal grants or cooperative agreements.

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### 3. Two-Factor Authentication

Keeping track of unique usernames and passwords for every system you use is frustrating and time-consuming. For over a year, GrantSolutions has offered recipients the ability to access the system through Login.gov. Accessing the GrantSolutions system through Login.gov enables you to have a single username and password for Federal systems, such as SAM.gov, Grants.gov, eRA Commons and GrantSolutions.

**Beginning on January 1, 2022**, GrantSolutions will complete the transition for all recipients to access the system through Login.gov. At that time, in support of the President's executive order on [Improving the Nation's Cybersecurity](#), you will be required to use the **Login.gov button** on the login page and will no longer access the system through the GrantSolutions Username and Password option.

### **NSF Updates-DGA Quarterly Meeting**

12/14/2021

- Preliminary proposals, full proposals related to a preliminary proposal, center, and research infrastructure proposal types are now supported in Research.gov. The program solicitation will clearly state whether Research.gov is available for submission.
- Program solicitations that permit a Project Description to exceed 15 pages are now supported in Research.gov. Proposers must follow the Project Description page limit requirements in the program solicitation. Proposers also should be aware that page limit requirements in a solicitation may vary by track or program. For a program solicitation that does not include Project Description page limit instructions, follow the guidance in the PAPPG.
- New automated compliance checks and associated error and warning messages for the newly enabled proposal and submission types were also implemented. Error messages will prohibit proposal submission to NSF, whereas warning messages still permit proposal submission.
- NSF is transitioning all proposal preparation and submission from FastLane to Research.gov by a target date of December 31, 2022.

- NSF has issued an updated PAPPG effective October 4<sup>th</sup>, which includes changes to the NSF biosketch and current & pending support documents. Please be sure you're referencing the correct version.
- We have received questions regarding the overlap statement on the current and pending template. The overlap refers to scope, budget, or person-months.
